

FRED WINTERBURN (Senior)



My Great Grandfather, Fred Winterburn, had been stationed at the camp about 1902.

Fred was a Sergeant Major, in The South Lancashire Regiment and his rank gave him the privilege of taking his wife Betty Winterburn, nee Halsall and all their children with them, wherever he deployed.

In September 1902, their daughter Louise Edith May Winterburn was born at Shorncliffe, but Louise sadly died in March 1903.

On the 25th January 1904, my Grandma, Violet May Carrington was born at Shorncliffe and Fred was shortly afterwards, deployed back to The South Lincs barracks in Warrington, where 2 of my Gran's brothers, George and William were born.

In 1906, Fred and all his Family returned back to Shorncliffe, shortly before they were all transferred with The South Lincs to Ranikhet, Bengal and Napier Barracks, Lahore Cantonment, Northern India for 4 years, before returning back to Shorncliffe.

On the 31st May 1940, my Great Grandfather, Fred Winterburn passed away and below is his Obituary, that was displayed in the Warrington Guardian newspaper, after the funeral.

ATTENDED QUEEN VICTORIA'S FUNERAL



Mr Fred Winterburn, 6 School St, Warrington, who has died at the age of 68 years, served 21 years in the Army, during which period he was a member of the Guard at Queen Victoria's funeral, and also was present at the unveiling of the Colonel O'Leary monument in Queen's Gardens.

Mr. R F WINTERBURN'S ARMY CAREER



Born in Harrogate, he enlisted in the South Lancashire Regiment in 1890, and served in the Boer War. He took part in the relief of Ladysmith and battle of Tugela Heights.

After completing 21 years' service, he again enlisted, and served for three years in the Great War, receiving his discharge in 1917.

He then worked at intervals as a night watchman in the employ of Warrington Electricity Department.

THE FUNERAL

The Rev. J.E. N. Coleman (St James) officiated at the interment, which took place at Warrington Cemetery on Monday.
